
Chippenham Mission Area (OUR Mission Area) – Autumn Update

Eco-Church: Award for St Mary's, Marshfield

St Mary's Church has just won a community award from South Gloucestershire Council for its eco actions. The Climate and Nature Emergency Competition was set up to celebrate 5 years of S Glos Council action since the authority signed its climate and nature emergency declaration. The church will receive £100 towards churchyard management costs. See the link here for a 3 minute promotional video produced by the



Council : <u>https://youtu.be/yxqioZoGUfM</u> Following an energy audit, St Mary's took decisive action to become a Net Zero carbon church. Solar panels were installed on the church roof; oil-fuelled heaters were replaced with an electric chandelier heating and lighting system complete with LED bulbs; and the churchyard petrol mower and strimmer were replaced with rechargeable battery powered machines. The churchyard is now managed for nature and people and the latest initiative is St Mary's Scythers, a team of volunteers trained to use traditional scythes to cut back the grass and wildflower

sward after the spring and summer growth. An eight-bin composting system, three beehives, sustainable floristry initiative, zero chemicals policy and a swift hotel in the bell tower add to the actions taken which has allowed the church to use the £10,000 grant offered towards net zero carbon outcomes.

The Diocese is now using St Mary's as a resource for those who wish to see chandelier heaters in action or find out about PV panels on south facing church roofs. St Mary's Marshfield has also recently achieved the Silver Eco Church Award and are well on the way to Gold.

Accounts for 2024

It was agreed at Deanery Synod that the subscription for 2024 should return to the pre-COVID sum of £20 per representative and a request for this was sent out to PCC Treasurers in March. The response has been very good, many Treasurers choosing to pay by bank transfer instead of by cheque and 70% of parishes had paid by July. A

reminder in August resulted in five more payments (Total received £780). The two still outstanding are Grittleton and Nettleton (£40). Only expenditure £33.00 to St Peter's PCC for hire of rooms.
